

## Republican Jubilee of 1860.

The republicans of Springfield celebrated the election of Mr. Lincoln on the evening of November 20, 1860. The "Journal" of the following day gave a four-column report of the jubilee. There was an immense crowd, and impressive street parade, an elaborate display of fireworks and speeches by several distinguished republicans. The street procession was made up largely of the "wide-awake clubs" from surrounding towns. They of course passed the residence of Mr. Lincoln and called him out for a speech. The brief address which he made on that occasion appears in the Nicolay and Hay collection of Lincoln's writings and speeches.
