Dear Mr. Reynolds:

You better send the Lincoln material back to me. There was a misunderstanding about the serial publication. I turned the letters over to Emanuel Hertz for a book, which was to come out in the Spring - told him that I expected to publish these serially somewhere in February. He said it would not interfere with his plans. If I understand Miss Winn correctly he is using the letters now in The Times. We better drop the whole matter. I am very sorry that, through his or my misunderstanding of his plans, I should have made your office and the Herald Tribune people so much futile work.
