My dear Miss Tarbell,

You may possibly recall some correspondence with me at the time when you were preparing the biography of Lincoln. In a recent number of the Tribune Magazine I was much pleased to read some account of you by one of your admirers; for altho' I have just passed the 83<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of my antiquity I have not lost interest in your work. I am glad to find that you still <sup>are</sup> in vigorous health, & able & ready to keep right on with your chosen & accustomed task. I wish that were my situation;

for on the inside, by the grace of  
God, I feel younger than at 21,  
when I knew nothing of that grace.  
I carry in mind, a programme of  
work that would more than  
fill so years of health; but my  
health has long been broken, &  
I am here in the hands of a  
nurse under treatment for arthritis.  
I have wondered whether you  
still purpose any further edit  
of your two vols. Lincoln; as new  
material on his life seems to  
come out every year. A recent  
note that you may have seen  
I enclose. Read at the time  
in the Atlantic mo. Those articles  
on Lincoln & on Rutledge, & I'd  
be glad to learn if you think the  
account trustworthy. They were  
certainly of deep interest & seemed  
valid. Has any contrary evidence  
appeared? The Atlantic for last  
month has a paper on Lincoln's  
attitude to the liquor problem  
that seems prepared from first  
hand sources.

I have a few more clippings that  
I would send you if I could get <sup>at</sup> them,  
but with all my books & papers  
they are in cold storage out of  
present reach. You certainly  
were the first to do justice to  
his early life; & for that re-  
search & record while it was  
still possible to make it, we  
are all immeasurably indebted  
to your care & competence & labor.  
What Chas H. Dana said of it  
will always be true.
