Sept. 21st 1862

Dear Mother

I had a few moments to spare and thought I would write a few lines to you. I let you know how we are all of the boys are well and so am I and hope all of you are the same we have all we want to eat and drink and as long as we have that I am all right I send the Crawford Co. Pay roll yesterday and it will be sent to Meadville on Monday with Mr. Hamilton. he was in camp the other day one of his boys be to the Co. William is to draw the money 15 dollars now and 15 at the end of three months do what you like with it did you ever get that valiece at Hendersons on the Diamond law office. How is grandmother and Liza and her children are they all well, we have nice weather down here with but little rain how is Wm. getting along with the house is Bill Torkin drafted . Write how many there is drafted in town for I would like to know who they are. I am getting tired of writing, so good by to all. W. A. Cutter
